Dr. Olga Barbasiewicz

A political scientist and Japanologist, assistant professor at the Institute of Middle and Far Eastern Studies at the Jagiellonian University, and a recipient of the scholarship for Outstanding Young Researchers from the Ministry of Science and Higher Education (2018–2021). She is a graduate of the University of Warsaw, the swps University of Social Sciences and Humanities, the Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University in Warsaw, and a fellow in the Department of International Studies at the University of Tsukuba in Japan. She curated the exhibition “Polish Ambassador to Japan Tadeusz Romer and Jewish war refugees in the Far East”, while her research is focused on the politics of memory and unification in the context of the Second World War in Europe and East Asia.

Prof. Sabina Bober

A historian and director of the Workshop on the History of National Minorities in Central Europe at the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin. She is the organizer of the International Holocaust Remembrance Day in the Lublin region. Her research is focused, among others, on the issues of national minorities in interwar Poland. One of her particular areas of interest is Jewish resistance during the Holocaust and the stance of Poles towards their Jewish neighbors seeking shelter. In relation to the latter, she has conducted interviews in both Israel and New York with Holocaust survivors and their families.

A researcher at the Department of Political Movements and Ethnic Research at the Maria Curie-Skłodowska University in Lublin focused on Jewish and Roma issues in the 20th century and the problem of refugees during the Second World War, a specialist at the Historical Research Office at the Institute of National Remembrance in Warsaw, secretary of “Polish-Jewish Studies”, a nascent publication dedicated to Polish-Jewish relations in the 20th century.

A historian, Jewish studies expert, and educator, she works at the Historical Research Office at the Institute of National Remembrance. She is a fellow of the Foundation for Polish Science and a finalist of the “Polityka” magazine’s Scientific Awards. Martyna Grądzka-Rejak specializes in the history of the Second World War, the Holocaust, national and ethnic minorities, women, and in social history.

Dr. Katarzyna Jedynak

A historian and graduate of the Department of History at the Jan Kochanowski University of Kielce, the director of the Department of Martyrological Education at the Museum of Martyrdom of the Polish Village of Michniów (part of the Kielce Folk Museum). Her research concerns the social activity of the landed gentry in the central voivodeships of the Second Polish Republic. Katarzyna Jedynak also studies the methods of repression used by the German and Soviet occupiers against Poland's rural population during the Second World War.

Dr. Sławomir Mańko

A historian and graduate of the Institute of History at the University of Warsaw, he defended his PhD thesis in 2009. He has worked at the Foundation for the Preservation of Jewish Heritage in Poland (2004–2009), and thereafter at the Archives of the Office of the capital city of Warsaw. He has co-operated in research undertaken by, among others, the Institute of National Remembrance, the Museum of the Polish Peasant Movement, and the Jewish Historical Institute. Sławomir Mańko specializes in the socio-political history of Poland in the 20th century, with a particular focus on the history of Polish rural areas and the issue of national minorities.
